Spring

Dear Parents/carers

Here we go with another busy term in Year 6. We have many interesting and exciting opportunities planned throughout Terms 3 and 4, and these are detailed below.

Topics this term: Term 3 and 4: A Wartime Childhood and Going Global

Our first topic looks at the experiences of children through the Second World War. This will include finding out about Evacuation, the Blitz and how war affected their daily lives.

In addition, this term's Geography will include our topic **Going Global**. We will be improving our Geographical skills through map work, locational knowledge and compass work. Geography will also focus on maps of Europe relating to WW2.

English

We begin with a focus on biographical writing leading to creating our own biographies of famous and influential people. We will explore diary entries and recounts in connection with our WW2 topic and excerpts from the Diary of Anne Frank. All children will be part of a guided reading group. They will focus on a book which they will read and analyse together. Each group will be led by one of the class teachers on a weekly basis. We will continue to teach Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation (SPaG) in a discrete weekly session, as well as through other English lessons, where appropriate. Weekly spelling tests will continue.

Science

Science will be investigating Light and Sight. We will explore the physics how light travels and how shadows are created and changed. The children will investigate reflection and refraction of light. In biology children will study the structure of the eye and how we see.

Maths

Maths will be taught through differentiated groups. Coverage this term will be balanced and appropriate according to the individual needs of your child. Whatever level your child is working at, their needs will be both supported and challenged. All children will build upon their existing understanding of the number and place value system. They will consolidate strategies and application of the four operations to solve problems in line with the new, and now current, curriculum. On Fridays, the main focus of maths will be developing formal written methods in line with the new style Arithmetic assessment.

Computing

We will be learning how to keep ourselves safe when using the Internet and considering aspects of cyber bullying.

We will also be developing our Coding Skills.

Other Subjects

Music sessions are fortnightly with our Specialist Music Teacher, Mrs Scaber.

Art/DT – We will be exploring colour mixing and creating colour wheels with paint. Connections with our WW2 topic will include using a variety of medium to create Blitz silhouettes and Propaganda posters. In D.T. children will create Wartime gardens, look at food rations and try our hand at Wartime Cookery.

Outdoor PE units this term include: netball, basketball, football and gym. Dance units will link to our history topic and explore creative dance with an evacuation theme.

PSHE – We will be discussing our responsibilities as citizens and the role we all play in looking after each other in our class, our family and our community. This will be reinforced by our highly successful and valuable trip to Rewley Road Fire Station where the children will be part of the Junior Citizen Programme working with members of different Emergency Services. We view this visit as a crucial stepping stone to Secondary School transition.

French will be taught by our specialist French teacher, Mrs George.
