Welcome



Kilvrough– where and what is it?

- Kilvrough Manor is situated on the Gower Peninsula, an area of ‘Outstanding Natural Beauty’.
- The Manor is a former country home but has been owned and maintained by Oxfordshire County Council since the 1960’s.
- It is now a Local Authority Outdoor Activity Centre offering a range of courses and residential visits for children.





Kilvrough– why are we going there?

- Offers a range of outdoor activities, led by qualified instructors.
- Good accommodation and meals.
- Lots of space for children to let off energy!
- The visit complements the residential that your children did in Y4.
- We've had five very successful visits from Dunmore.





Accommodation

- Accommodation in dormitory rooms
- Wash, shower and toilet facilities are close at hand
- Staff rooms are close by





Meals

- All meals are provided
- The meals are very child friendly
- Vegetarian and special diets are catered for
- Your children will not starve!





Staffing

School staff will accompany the children. In addition, trained instructors from the Centre lead all the activities.

Just a few other things to mention

- Insurance is included in the cost
- All specialist clothing and equipment is provided by the Centre
- A full kit list will be sent in February
- Children must not bring valuables, money, jewellery or mobile phones on the visit

Payment



- Total cost is £325 per child. This includes travel, accommodation, meals, all the activities, staff and insurance.
- A deposit of £75 is due by Friday 3rd November 2017, the balance of £250 should be paid by Monday 30th April 2018.
- Payment can be made in instalments, or in a lump sum.
